



## Saul Becomes King

### SUPPLIES NEEDED

For each child you will need the following:

- 1 Chinet plate (10 3/8")

  - 8 Sticky-back Gems

- Yellow Paint Marker

### DIRECTIONS

- Use a ruler to draw 4 lines on the bottom of the plate dividing it into 8 pieces (see Picture A).
- Use yellow paint marker to paint the inside of the top of the plate. Then flip it over and paint the entire bottom of the plate yellow (see pictures B & C).
- After the paint is dry, use an Exacto knife to cut the first line, then you can use scissors to cut the other lines.
- During class, give each child a yellow plate. Ask them the questions on page 2, letting the children take turns answering. After they answer a question correctly, they can stick a gem on their crown and fold the "point" up. When the crowns are completed, they can wear it.

### TIPS

- Depending on the size of your students' heads, you might not want to cut the lines all the way to the edge of the curved part of the plate.



## Questions

1. Who was the last judge?  
(Samuel)
2. What did the people want to make them like other nations?  
(a king)
3. What tribe was Saul from?  
(Benjamin)
4. How does the Bible describe Saul?  
(handsome and a head taller than everyone)
5. What did Saul's father Kish, send Saul to look for?  
(donkeys)
6. What did Samuel ask Saul to do?  
(eat and spend the night with him)
7. What did Samuel pour on Saul's head to anoint him?  
(olive oil)
8. Was everyone happy that Saul was now king?  
(no)
